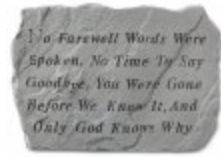
Annabelle was a member of St. George Church and involved in SALT (Tinley Park Seniors) a resident of Tinley Park for 53 years.
