January 28, 1950 - May 25, 2022

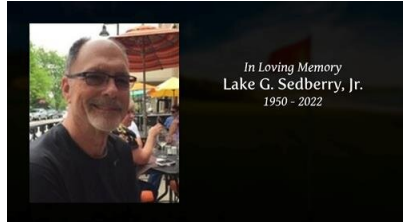
