Rev. David A. Steuernagel, 73, of Crete, was called home by his Lord on April 3, 2010. He is survived by his daughter, Paula; his brothers Robert and Steve; sisters Kathy, Mary, Betty Lou, Deanna, and Jeanine, and sisters-in-law, Marcella and Claire. Preceded by his wife, Dorothea nee Quiram, February 10, 2003. They were joined in marriage August 21, 1960. Rev. Steuernagel was the senior pastor at St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church, Chicago Heights from 1993 to 2004. He retired in 2008 and returned as vacancy pastor July 2009. Rev. Steuernagel was ordained at Immanuel Lutheran Church (Silo) of Lewiston, MN on July 7, 1964. He received both his B. Div. and M. Div. degrees from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri. M. Ed., 1964, Presbyterian School of Christian Education, Richmond, VA. He served as pastor of Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Richmond, VA, Redemption Lutheran Church, Sterling Heights, MI, and Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Excelsior, MN. Former Director of Development Lutheran High School North, Detroit, MI. Rev. Steuernagel served the church at large in various capacities including Chairman of the Board for Luther East High School, Lansing, IL.
