Growing a garden was important until dad's employment supported the family sufficiently. She encouraged her girls to learn the art of sewing and taught her children the frugality of handling money. She was always by her husband's side repairing and cleaning rental properties, handling their hard-earned investments which assisted financially in their retirement years. She enjoyed working in the yard and tending to her flowers. She loved her feathered friends in her later years. Even when she couldn't get out of her wheelchair, someone had to buy bird seed and make sure her birds were fed. Her motto was the Jones' had to keep up with her, not her keeping up with the Jones'.
